## Words from Pastor Rae Lynn

When I was growing up, my parents gave us an allowance each week. We were expected to give a portion of our allowance to the church and we were to decide for ourselves how much we wanted to give. I remember receiving fifteen cents, one dime and one nickel. I must have been around six years old when I received this incredible amount of money. Some of you may recall that for one penny you could get one or two pieces of candy and for six cents at the local corner market, I could get an ice cream cone.

So, there I was with one dime and one nickel always feeling quite wealthy and having to decide how much I was going to put in the offering plate each Sunday. I did not know about a tithe when I was six, but I did know that the dime was worth more than the nickel, so the church got the nickel. Just seemed to me to make sense, give the church the coin that was worth the least amount. I still had the dime!

Much later in life, as I reflected upon my first lessons on giving to the church, I realized that even though the nickel was worth less, I was contributing to the church not ten percent of my weekly income, but 30% of my weekly income! I wish I could be prideful of that, but it was not given from the heart. It was given because my parents expected us to practice giving.

We are moving into stewardship month, and the first week we will spend a bit of time in our worship service talking about our financial giving to the church. Most persons would rather avoid such topics, but I find that I enjoy being able to give financially to the church and to God's work. I enjoy this congregation, this place where God has called me to serve and with that joy comes the joy of wanting to support the ministries here, the building, the variety of needs, the mission work, everything that makes us strong as a faith community.

But the question is often asked of me, "How do we decide what to give, to give financially and to give in time and service?" My first response in this letter will be to discern our financial gift to the church. I believe that we are called to consider what percent of our income we are willing and able to offer God and the church. Many of us decide a dollar amount to give, but the healthiest way to know if we are moving towards a tithe is to do the math and then decide if we are able to step up another percent, half percent or two percent this year towards a tithe if we are not yet there.

Most persons figure their tithe on their net income; others figure the tithe on their gross income. That is a decision personal to you. If you do the math and you discover that you are giving 3% of your income to the church, then the decision becomes a prayerful decision. Am I able to give an additional 1% more this next year? Where am I with my family's needs? Is my work secure? What does my giving say about my spiritual relationship with God? Do I want to move closer in my spiritual walk with God? Is God calling me to do more at this time?

Have these conversations with members in your family; make it a spiritual conversation, not a financial conversation. Look at all the places the family income goes and ask what that tells you about who your family is. And then decide together, where this year you want God to be in the midst of the family's bills, expenses and entertainment money. This could be an interesting conversation.

The second decision we each need to make this month in October is the decision about where I am called to serve. On October 4<sup>th</sup> and the 11<sup>th</sup>, when you come into worship, you will find the church filled with displays revealing the many, many ways in which we

#### NEW! Making Love Last A Lifetime

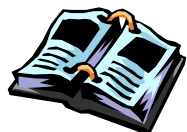

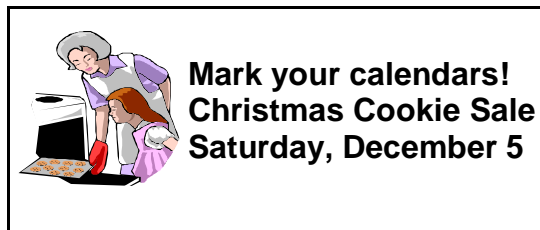
